She teaches our special needs prekindergarten (PK) class. At 3 years old, her students were identified by Colonial Hearing and Vision Center as having a Developmental Delay to qualify for Grahamwood's Special Needs PK.

Ms. Long says that a key to her success is that, "I love my students and like getting to know their families." Her class is unique in that there are a maximum of 14 stu-

dents who follow the TN Board of Education IDEA 619 Program—the same guidelines as required of all pre-school programs.

"All children can learn, and deserve a warm and welcoming educational environment," insists Ms. Long. "Every child can contribute in their own special way. I enjoy how they can surprise you." In writing this article, Ms. Long wanted to make sure her long time, outstand-

ing teaching assistant Keith Davis was recognized for his exceptional educational efforts.

Ms. Long earned her B.S. in Special Education at the University of Memphis and a Master of Science and Social Work degree from the University of Tennessee. She has been teaching for 21 years

with the last 8 being at Grahamwood.

As for hobbies, Ms. Long has horses and rescue dogs plus cats she takes in. Needless to say, this keeps her plenty busy! Grahamwood is very fortunate to have an educator as caring and capable as Sharon Long.

Outside of work, she enjoys knowing what is going on around town, visiting Shelby Farms' dog park with her rescue pup named Eddie, gardening (or trying to), and traveling. "Last summer I went to Greece," said Ms. Graves. "It was probably my favorite place to visit ever!"
